



GOLF TOUR OF ICELAND Summer 2011

ITINERARY:

June 23rd

Direct evening Icelandair flight from New York or Boston. Arriving in Iceland 06:30 on June 24th.

June 24th

Special transfer to Hotel Hilton Nordica (www.hiltonreykjavik.com). A day for relaxing, the Blue Lagoon or golfing (optional).

June 25th

In the morning, golf at Keilir Golf Club in Hafnarfjörður. Keilir golf course is a links golf course placed by the sea side. There is a vast difference between the front nine and the back nine. The front nine are surrounded by lava but the back nine are placed on a small peninsula.

June 26th

In the morning, golf at Reykjavík Golf Club Korpa. The Korpa golf course is one of the latest 18-hole golf courses in the country and has already established itself as one of the best golf courses in the country. There are two very different distinct nine holes on the course.

June 27th

In the morning, 2 hour city sightseeing tour with guide, afternoon free.

Midnight Ice Cup at Oddur Golf Club starts at 20.00 and will finish with price presentation and dinner buffet at 01.00.

The course was inaugurated in August 1997 and is now considered one of the finest golf courses in Iceland located within 20 minutes driving distance from the centre of Reykjavik.

June 28th

Morning free. At 13.00 a six hour sightseeing tour of Thingvellir National Park, Laugavatn, Gullfoss og Geysir.





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June 29th

In the morning, golf at Reykjavík Golf Club Grafarholt.

The Grafarholt golf course is the oldest 18-hole golf course in Iceland. The course is recognized as Iceland's premier championship venue and has hosted many European and Nordic tournaments. The course designer, used the existing rugged and varied landscape to produce arguably the toughest championship golf course in Iceland.

The south coast has a lot to offer. Drive to Landeyjarhofn on the south coast for a 40 min. ferry trip to Vestmannaeyjar for a round of golf at this unique 18 hole golf course. This is a must play golf course.

Thingvellir was declared a national park in 1930. A law was passed designating Thingvellir as “a protected national shrine for all Icelanders, the perpetual property of the Icelandic nation under the preservation of parliament, never to be sold or mortgaged.”

Nesjavellir Geothermal Plant is situated at Hengill, an active volcanic ridge in SW Iceland. The plant’s purpose is to meet increasing demand for electricity and hot water for space heating in the industrial and domestic sectors. Current production capacity is 213 MW (february 2009).

Geysir. Where you can walk around the world-famous Geysir geothermal area, a geothermal field where hot springs are in abundance, geysers explode and pools of mud bubble.

Gullfoss. The queen of Iceland’s waterfalls Gullfoss waterfall (engl. Golden waterfall) with its fabulous rainbows falling down into a large canyon. This is a must see !
